

## MARK YOUR CALENDARS

### Important 2020 dates:

**9/21:** Absentee Ballots Available  
*Note: You must first submit an absentee application; then, you can receive a ballot.*

**10/5:** Voter Registration Deadline

**10/31:** In-person Absentee Deadline

On or before **11/3:** Absentee Ballots Postmark Deadline

**11/3:** General Election



## VOTE!

### However you vote, keep in mind:

If you're voting absentee, make sure you've noted deadlines, followed the instructions for witnesses, and have enough time to submit your ballot.

If you're voting in person, be sure to take safety precautions due to COVID-19. Wear a mask if able, wash your hands, and social distance.



## CHECK YOUR ELIGIBILITY

### You can vote if these apply to you:

- United States Citizen
- State Resident
- 18 Years or Older on Election Day
- Registered to Vote



## CHOOSE HOW YOU'LL VOTE

### Ways to Vote:

- Absentee by Mail
- Absentee in Person
- Your Local Polling Place
- Provisional Ballot
- Curbside Voting



## KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

You have the right to vote privately.

You have the right to vote independently.

You have the right to an accessible polling place *and* an accessible ballot.

You have the right to have a person of your choosing help you cast your vote.

**Your vote matters. If any of these rights are violated or if you need assistance voting, contact DRMS.**
